Each department within State government submits their proposed budget to the Division of Administration. The Governor then reviews these proposals in the formation of the Executive Budget which is later presented to the legislature as House Bill 1 (HB 1).

Due to a projected revenue shortfall, all services are in danger of being cut (including those LaCAN successfully advocated for during the last legislative session).
