

# ACTION ALERT - Contact Senate Finance Committee to Protect Critical Supports and Services for Vulnerable Populations



Funding for essential services for children and adults with disabilities, seniors and other vulnerable populations is often at risk. These health care and support services are subject to the majority of cuts in times of budget shortfalls, as many other parts of the budget are protected. <u>SB 355</u> by Sen. Fred Mills calls for a constitutional amendment to provide protection for these critical services.

If you have not yet contacted members of the Senate Finance Committee in your region, there is still time to ask for their support in protecting critical health care and support services for vulnerable populations. SB 355 would provide for this protection. SB355 will tentatively be heard in Senate Finance on April 28th.

If protecting these services is important to you, **TAKE ACTION by the end of the day** on April 27th!

## Help Writing Your Email

## Begin by sharing your current situation: Write your opening sentence about you or your family or friends. Below are some examples.

- My son receives NOW waiver services. These and other services for people with developmental disabilities have been cut in the past.
- My daughter is on the waiting list for NOW waiver services. These and other services for people with developmental disabilities have been cut in the past.
- My child receives services through EarlySteps. These and other services for people with developmental disabilities have been cut in the past.
- We receive services through our regional human services authority. These and other services for people with developmental disabilities have been cut in the past.

# End by telling your legislator how he/she can help:

"Please protect the funding for critical supports and services to vulnerable populations. SB 355 would provide for this protection."

# Why confirm your action?

This helps us to know how effective we are in reaching you with this information and engaging members across our state in advocacy for systems change.

#### **Background Information**

Critical health care and support services are vulnerable because they are the few parts of the state budget that are not protected. These services include, but are not limited to:

- Home and community based waiver services
- Individual and family supports for people with disabilities
- Mental health services
- Hospice
- Services provided by Councils on Aging
- Primary care
- EarlySteps
- Employment supports for people with disabilities

Last year the legislature passed laws calling for constitutional protection of rates for hospitals, nursing homes, residential facilities for people with developmental disabilities,

and pharmacies. There is a bill in the 2014 session calling for constitutional protection for higher education. If these constitutional amendments are approved by voters in November, other health care and support services for seniors, people with disabilities and other vulnerable populations will take the brunt of cuts when there is a budget shortfall.
