



## State Personal Assistance Program (SPAS)

Quarterly and Cumulative Report FY 15-16

Project Period: October 1, 2015- December 31, 2015 (2nd Quarter)

One of the primary principles on which the SPAS program was founded is that adults with disabilities should be afforded the opportunity to make decisions for themselves and to live in typical homes and communities where they can exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens. Based on this principal, the SPAS program for the FY 2015-2016 is administered as follows:

Quarterly: African American (19)      Caucasian (25)      Hispanic (1)

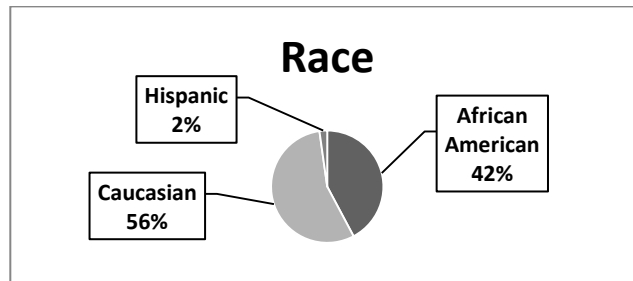

Quarterly: Male (25)      Female (20)

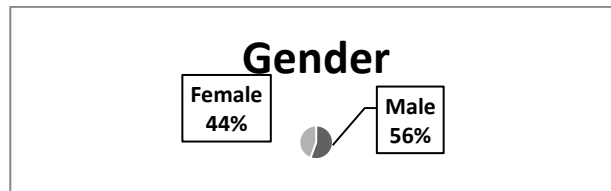

**Age:** Ranges from age 31 to 70.

**Disability:** Consumers represent a wide range of diversity in terms of disability, including acquired brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, visual impairment, muscular dystrophy, severe lung disease, acute renal

failure, multiple sclerosis, chronic kidney disease, sickle cell anemia, brain aneurysm, tuberous sclerosis, lennox-gastaut syndrome, charcot-marie tooth disease, closed head trauma, spondylosis, Para spinal muscle spasms, degenerative disc disease, partial paralysis, and individuals with multiple disabilities.

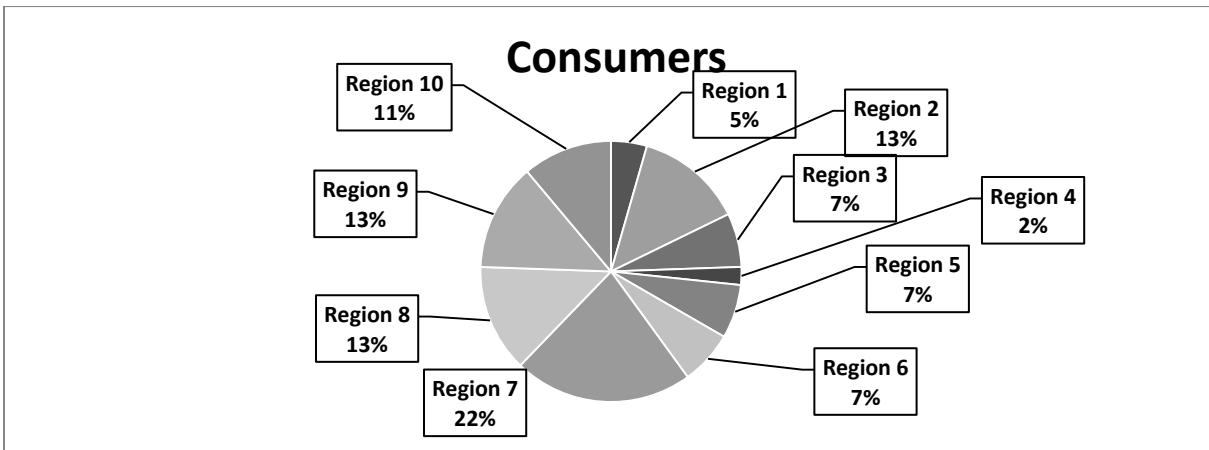

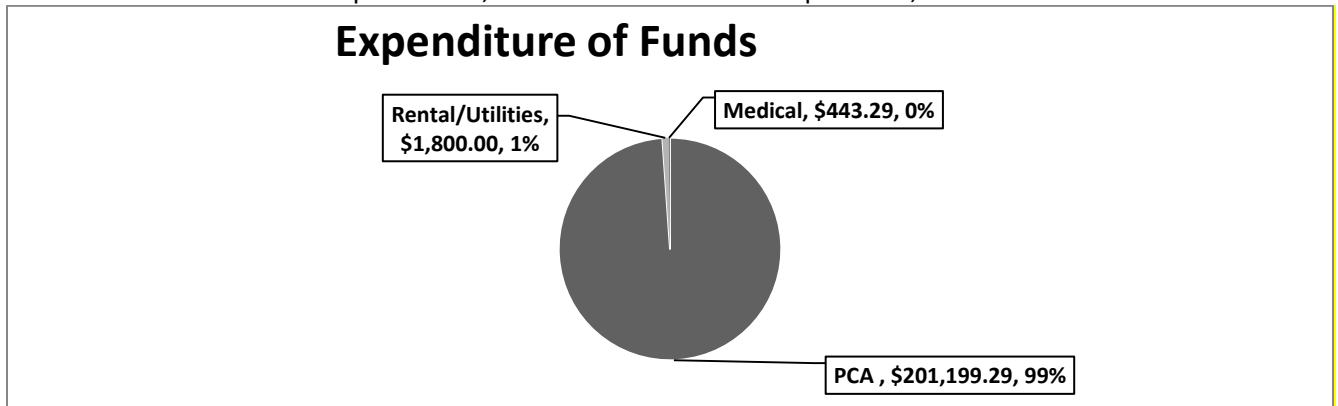

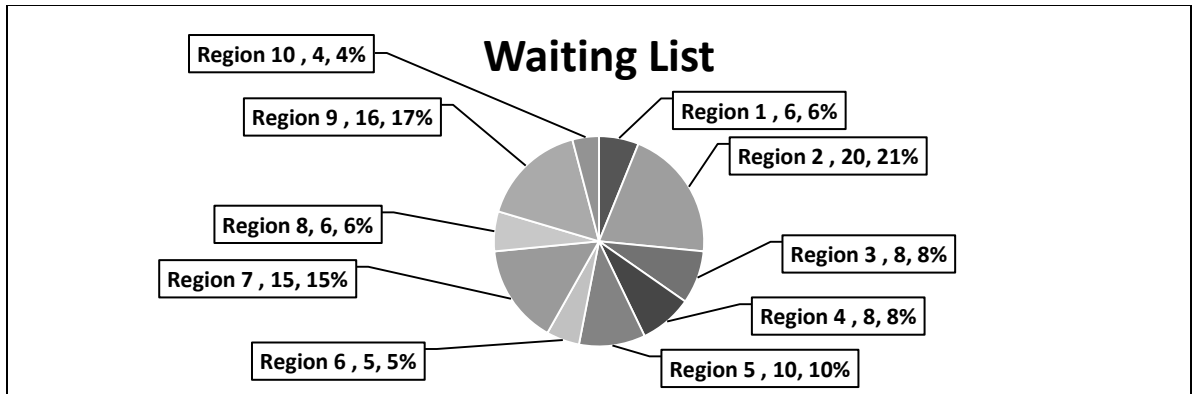
