Quarterly DD Council Report September 23, 2014

The Governor's Advisory Council on Disability Affairs met on September 3, 2014. The Council heard presentations on MLTSS (Managed Long-term Supports and Services), the Secretary of State's Disability Program for voting, and the 2014 Disability Works Job Fairs. In addition to having worked with the Louisiana Workforce Commission on the proclamation, GODA plans on having a constituent services representative at a number of job fairs, visiting the independent living centers, and continuing to reach out to workforce stakeholders. The Statewide Independent Living Council was established to support the efforts of citizens with disabilities to live independently in the community of their choice.
