

Action Alert #19 Contact Your Representative to Require Funding for DD Services

May 30, 2017



<u>Senate Bill 58</u> (SB58) passed the House Health & Welfare Committee on Tuesday, May 23rd and will be heard on the House Floor Thursday, June 1st. SB58 calls for changes to the Regional Human Services Districts/Authorities including:

- improving access to the Individual and Family Support and Flexible Family Fund programs across the state by requiring a minimum of 9% of funds be dedicated to these services for individuals with developmental disabilities;
- increasing representation of consumers/parents/advocates and professionals with experience in developmental disabilities on the boards of the Districts/Authorities.

Sixteen LaCAN members attended the House Health & Welfare Committee meeting Tuesday, May 23rd, to demonstrate how important services provided through the local Human Services Districts/Authorities are for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. Two of these members provided testimony before the committee asking members to support a minimum of 9% of the districts'/authorities' funding be dedicated to the Individual and Family Support and Flexible Family Fund programs for those with DD.
