Goal 1: Reduce incidences of inappropriate discipline and illegal exclusions from public schools.

Description of Target Population:

Students with disabilities in public elementary and secondary education who are inappropriately disciplined or illegally excluded in violation of procedural safeguards and/or substantive protections guaranteed under IDEA and Section 504.

Description of the problem to be addressed (include a discussion of existing barriers):

 Students with disabilities are often inappropriately disciplined or illegally excluded from public education without benefit of the procedural safeguards and/or substantive protections guaranteed under IDEA and Section 504.

Objectives (Measurable and Achievable within FY 2019):

- Provide representation to student(s) in public elementary and secondary education who are inappropriately disciplined or illegally excluded in violation of procedural safeguards and/or substantive protections guaranteed under IDEA and Section 504.
- Identify at least one (1) school district that arrests or disciplines students with disabilities in an inappropriate and/or disproportionate manner as compared to students without disabilities, and file at least one (1) complaint with appropriate state or federal agencies or courts.
- 3) Participate in the Advisory Council on Student Behavior and Discipline.
- 4) Participate in the Secure Care Task Force.
- 5) Work with the Community Living Ombudsman Program to identify two (2) students in group homes being excluded from or inappropriately disciplined in public education.
- f. Case Selection Criteria:

Within the limits of its resources, the Advocacy Center will consider cases that:

- Are meritorious.
- Address issues related to inappropriate discipline and illegal exclusions from elementary and secondary public and public charter schools.
- May have a systemic impact.
- Need Advocacy Center intervention to compel legal compliance.

Goal 2: Obtain appropriate transition services.

Description of Target Population:

Students with disabilities who are in need of appropriate transition services necessary to facilitate the student's movement from school to post-school activities including continuing education and competitive employment.

Description of the problem to be addressed (include a discussion of existing barriers):

 Students with disabilities often do not receive appropriate transition services that are necessary to facilitate the student's movement from school to post-school activities including continuing education and competitive employment.

Objectives (Measurable and Achievable within FY 2019):

- 1) Ensure that student(s) receive appropriate transition services necessary to facilitate the student's movement from school to post-school activities including continuing education and employment.
- 2) Conduct outreach and training events to fully educate parents and professionals about educational rights.

Goal 3: Educational Access

Description of Target Population:

Students denied access to elementary and secondary education in the public setting through the school's failure to provide appropriate assistive technology and related services.

Description of the problem to be addressed (include a discussion of existing barriers):

 Through the lack of assistive technology or appropriate related services, some students with disabilities are unable to access the educational curriculum.

Objectives (Measurable and Achievable within FY 2019):

- Represent at least 2 students who need, but are not receiving, an assistive technology device to access the educational curriculum.
- Represent at least 1 student who needs, but are not receiving, a behavioral, medical, or therapeutic related service to access the educational curriculum.

Case Selection Criteria:

- Are meritorious.
- Address issues related to the public school's failure to provide appropriate assistive technology and related services, where the denial of services severely impairs their ability to receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE).
- May have a systemic impact.
- Need Advocacy Center intervention to compel legal compliance.
