

**State Personal Assistance Program (SPAS)  
Quarterly and Cumulative Report FY 19-20  
Project Period: April 1, 2020 – June 31, 2020 (4<sup>th</sup> Quarter)**

One of the primary principles on which the SPAS program was founded is that adults with disabilities should be afforded the opportunity to make decisions for themselves and to live in typical homes and communities where they can exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens. Based on this principal, the SPAS program for the FY 2019-2020 is administered as follows:

Forty (50) consumers received services through the SPAS program this quarter.

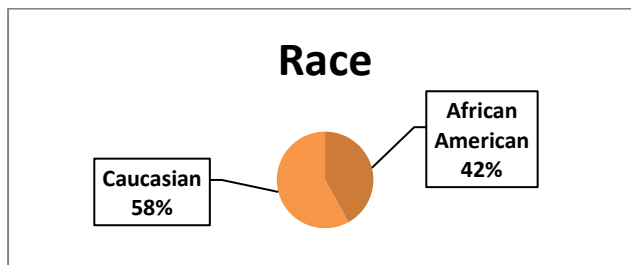

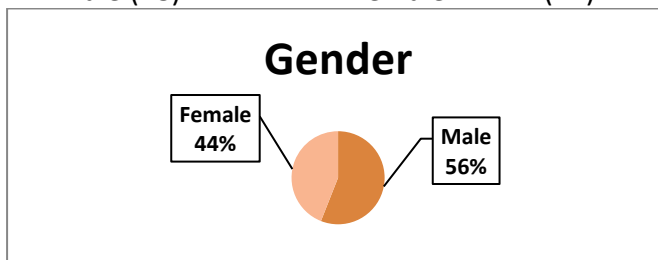
Quarterly: African American (21)    Caucasian (29)

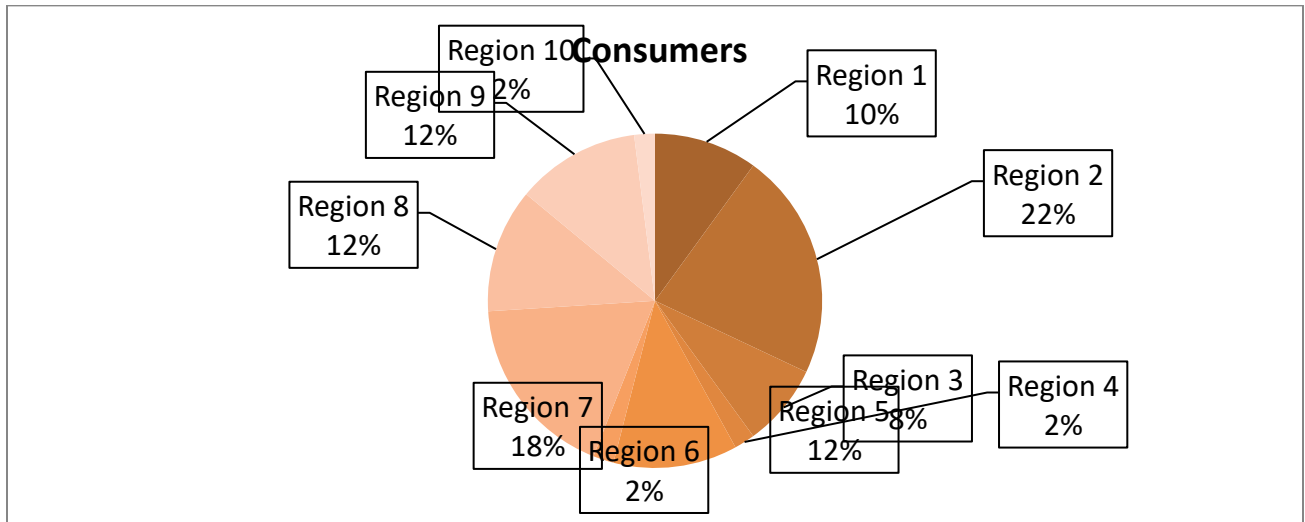
**Age:** Ranges from age 28 to 82.

**Disability:** Consumers represent a wide range of diversity in terms of disability, including acquired brain injury, Quadriplegia, spinal cord injury, stroke, visual impairment, muscular dystrophy, severe lung disease, acute renal failure, multiple sclerosis, chronic kidney disease, sickle cell anemia, brain aneurysm, partial paralysis, and individuals with multiple disabilities.

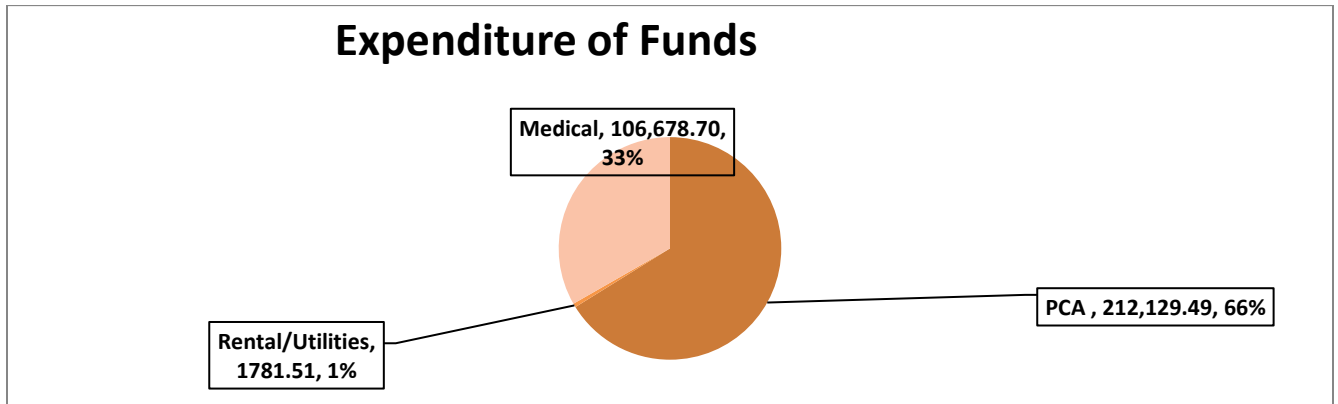

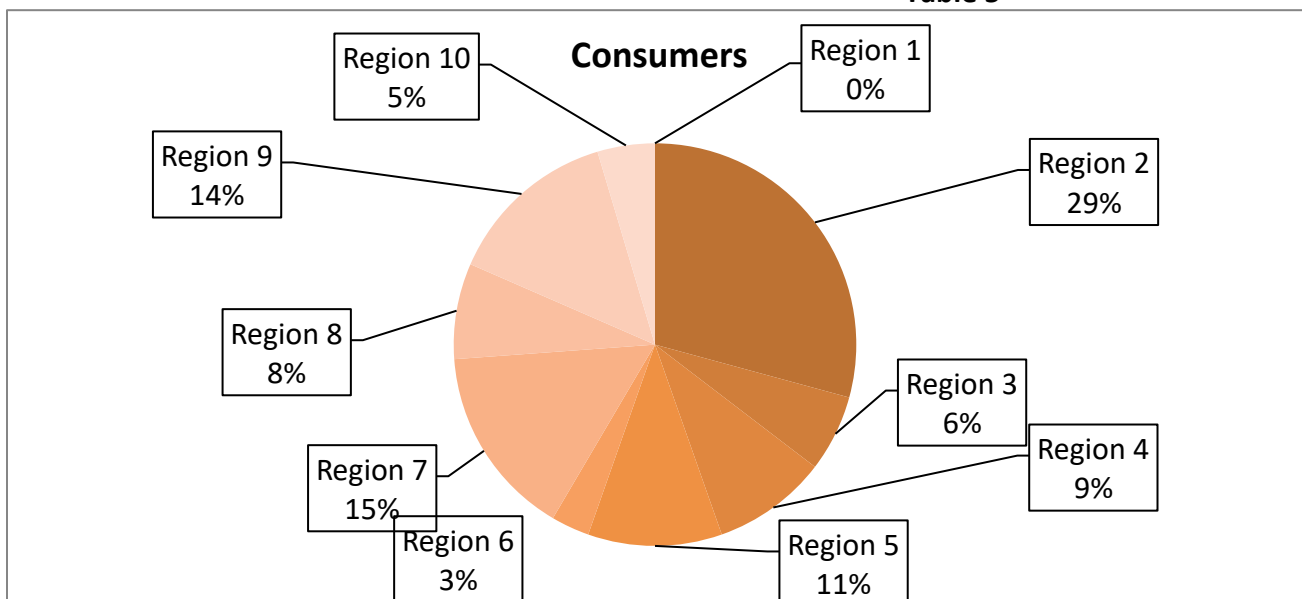
