

# Action Alert #15 Your State Senator Needs to Hear Why Disability Funding is Important!

May 26, 2021



The state's budget for Fiscal Year 22 (FY22) is being heard on the Senate Floor, and your State Senator Needs to hear from you!

Thursday, May 27<sup>th</sup>

Senate meets to vote on the state's Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) budget, which begins July 1<sup>st</sup> (<u>agenda</u>). <u>HB1</u> is listed as Special Order Number 1.

The Senate Finance Committee met on Monday, May 24<sup>th</sup>, and passed an amended version of the state's main budget bill (<u>HB1</u>). The great news is, in its current form, the budget *does* include the following items which benefit the disability community:

- 1. Additional funding for the Families Helping Families (FHF) Regional Resource Centers
- 2. Approximately \$16.3 million in state general fund (SGF) to increase home- and community-based (HCBS) rates
- 3. Implementation costs of dental coverage for individuals with developmental disabilities should HB172 be enacted into law
- 4. 500 additional Community Choices Waiver slots for seniors and those with adult onset disabilities

Unfortunately, the version of the budget that passed *does not* include all the funding requested to increase HCBS rates and language for DSW starting pay:

 Funding to increase home and community-based service rates for those services provided by Direct Support Workers (DSW) and a minimum starting pay requirement of at least \$8.65 per hour for DSWs
