

Action Alert #19 Tell Congress to Invest in Medicaid Home- and Community-Based Services

October 7, 2021

Individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and their families have voiced their concerns for years that the Medicaid system they rely on to meet their needs is insufficient. Nationwide, the IDD population has been plagued by long waiting lists for services and a dwindling, underpaid direct support workforce. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has only made matters worse and showed just how much of an overhaul is needed to the infrastructure of care designed to support the IDD community.

As part of the current administration's Build Back Better plan, the <u>Better Care Better Jobs Act</u> (BCBJA) was introduced to Congress. BCBJA would be a historic investment in Medicaid home- and community-based services (HCBS). HCBS services provide the IDD community with the supports and services needed to live in their own homes or with their families and fully participate and be included in their communities. Originally, it was believed this plan would include approximately \$400 billion in funding for Medicaid HCBS, but as Congress negotiates its reconciliation package that amount has been reduced significantly.
