

# Action Alert #3 Senate Education Needs to Hear from You About Cameras in Special Education Classrooms!

March 22, 2022



Let members of Senate Education know how you feel about addressing oversight and accountability of cameras in special education classrooms!

Wednesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> Senate Education meets at 1 PM to discuss Senator Foil's bill (<u>SB45</u>) which would require all public school governing authorities to adopt policies relative to cameras in self-contained special education classrooms by December 31, 2022. (Agenda)

Act 456 of 2021 requires governing authorities of public and charter schools to adopt policies relative to the installation and operation of cameras in special education classrooms upon request. This issue received unanimous support from both the state House and Senate. Unfortunately, many districts have failed to develop and implement any such policy despite the law requiring them to do so. Oversight and accountability is needed to ensure appropriate and timely implementation of the law.

Cameras play an important role in ensuring the safety of students with disabilities and educators. Students with disabilities, particularly students who are non-verbal, are at greater risk of abuse and do not have the communication skills to self-report this abuse. Video and audio surveillance not only increases student safety but also protects educators from false accusations and promotes improved training to address students' challenging behaviors.

If <u>addressing oversight and accountability regarding cameras in special education classrooms</u> is important to you or someone you know, **NOW** is the time to take action!
