The <u>Inclusive Art Contest</u> enables participants to increase awareness of the importance of inclusion in today's society through artistic expression. Entries should illustrate or describe ideas related to this year's theme: "Show Your True Colors and Abilities" The Inclusive Art Contest is open to any resident of Louisiana, with and without disabilities of any age. A medal and special recognition from Governor John Bel Edwards will be presented to the winners.

Statewide Interagency Coordinating Council (SICC)

The SICC met on July 14, 2022. The council received a report from Andy Gromm pertaining to the Louisiana EarlySteps Child Find Project. Through this project, Louisiana was awarded a grant through Prizker Children's initiative with the goal of increasing the number of infants and toddlers receiving quality developmental services. In addition to Gromm's report, April Hearon provided updates on the Service Delivery Supports Family Priorities. They have met three times this quarter, finalizing all home visiting fidelity tools used for observation. Additionally, there has been training sessions with regional coordinators.

Emergency Management Disability and Aging Coalition (EMDAC)

The Louisiana Emergency Management Disability and Aging Coalition (EMDAC) has updated the Louisiana Guide to Supports & Services for Individuals with Disabilities, Elders and Their Families Affected by Disasters. This guide provides the description and contact information of state agencies, education services, communication, transportation, advocacy and support groups, and disability specific organizations. Voting Accessibility (HCR14 Task Force)

HCR14 of the 2022 Legislative Session created a task force on accessible voting for people with disabilities. The task force will be making recommendations to the Secretary of State on the most accessible type of voting machine, and how to make the entire voting experience more accessible to people with disabilities. The first meeting was held on 09/27/22 and the second meeting was held on 10/10/22. The next meeting is scheduled to be held 01/09/23.

Virtual Participation in Public Meetings (SR147 Task Force)

SR147 of the 2022 Legislative Session created a task force on virtual participation in hybrid meetings. SR147 required one task force member to be a member

of the disability community, as virtual participation greatly increases accessibility. This task force had its first meeting on 9/13/22. It was suggested that, at upcoming meetings, discussion should pertain best practices for hybrid meetings and virtual participation as a disability accommodation. The next meeting date is not yet scheduled, but we encourage the disability community to participate in these meetings. It was also mentioned that SR147 members may sit in on a Louisiana Developmental Disabilities Council (LaDDC) meeting to observe how they successfully conduct hybrid meetings.

National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM)

Gov. John Bel Edwards has proclaimed October as "Disability Employment Awareness Month" in Louisiana. Every October, National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) celebrates the contributions of America's workers with disabilities past and present and showcases supportive, inclusive employment policies and practices. In recognition of the important role people with disabilities play in a diverse and inclusive American workforce, the theme for National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) 2022 will be "Disability: Part of the Equity Equation." ODEP also has a "31 Days of NDEAM" calendar with daily activity ideas as well as specific ideas for disability-related organizations and employers.
