IICHSA	Q1 - CCR total obligated is approved applications not yet paid. FFF (CS) total obligated is encumbered monies to be paid throughout year. Initial CCR budget of 35% of \$24735 (\$8657) plus \$50000 additional FY23 funding from ARPA Initiative to be split between CY (35% - \$17500) and Adult (65%-\$32500). Q2Reallocated \$15,658 to adults due to receiving more applications on the adult side. Since COVID and Hurricane Laura we are seeing more adult needs in our region.
CLHSD	Walmart gift cards for educational games & crafts to help with bonding & family time, hot water heater for family to be able to take hot baths; this report is only through Nov and a final for Quarter 2 will be sent after receiving December invoices - KPhillips (12/28/22)
NLHSD	We have served 38 families with CCR. We have kept a lot of utilities from being disconnected as families have gotten behind due to illness and loss of work hours. We also assisted families with food for the holidays by having our case managers purchase food and deliver it to families. We also paid for driver's education for a couple of our teens. We currenly have 21 of our 23 cash subsidy slots filled and have two families scheduled for assessment after the holday to fill our 2 age out slots. Note: NLHSD reports that at the end of Q2 they were still working on executing agreements with families for the 2 unfilled slots. As of January 2023 NLHSD reports all slots are now filled.
NEDHSD	CCR funds were used to pay rental deposits, rent payments, utilities, purchase appliances and home furnising. Funds were also used to pay for car repairs, driver's education, monthly bus passes and educational training.

FPHSA	CCR invoice for November & December has not been received by FPHSA yet. CCR funds were used for utility bills (electricity), rent, furniture lease, emergency hotel stay, and appliance (refrigerator) purchase. Plan to expend a large amount of funds towards the end of the fiscal year on summer camps.
JPHSA	Regarding CCR, a total of \$57,420 in MHBG funds are utilized for Respite Services. A total of \$15,000 in State General Funds are utilized for Special Funding. Total expended includes July through November Respite Service payments, as December payments are not due until January 10, 2023.
