### Recap of the 2023 Legislative Session

The 2023 Regular Legislative Session ended June 8, 2023. The Governor's Advisory Council on Disability Affairs made recommendations on over 20 legislative instruments; GODA tracked approximately 100 legislative items. Disability Voting Task Force: <u>HB449 by Representative Willard</u>: provides relative to the rights of voters with disabilities. Now Act 277. Effective 06/09/23.

Remote Operations of Public Meetings Task Force: <u>SB201 by Senator Hewitt:</u> provides for meetings of boards and commissions via electronic means. Now Act 393. Effective 08/01/23.

The <u>Governor's Advisory Council on Disability Affairs</u> held its quarterly meetings from June 19<sup>th</sup> - 21st. The next round of meetings will take place in September.
