One of the primary principles on which the SPAS program was founded is that adults with disabilities should be allowed to make decisions and live in typical homes and communities where they can exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens. 


Disability: Consumers represent a wide range of diversity in terms of disability, including acquired brain injury, Quadriplegia, spinal cord injury, stroke, visual impairment, muscular dystrophy, severe lung disease, acute renal failure, multiple sclerosis, chronic kidney disease, sickle cell anemia, brain aneurysm, partial paralysis, and individuals with various disabilities.






Waiting List – Currently, there are 89 people on the waiting list to receive services.




