

Eliminate the Flexible Family Fund Wait List

FACTS

- Families raising children with the most severe disabilities incur extraordinary expenses.
- Families report that raising a child with severe disabilities negatively impacts their ability to work and/or increase their income.
- The Flexible Family
 Fund program provided
 support to 1,796
 families with I/DD and
 336 with behavioral
 health needs in the first
 quarter of FY24.
- Unfortunately, 2,167 children with I/DD and 91 with behavioral health needs were on the Flexible Family Fund waiting list.
- This program is on a first come, first served basis. So, depending on where you live, the wait may be 1—4 years long, if not longer!

What Can Legislators Do?

Appropriate an additional \$9.4 million in State General Funds (SGF) to eliminate the Flexible Family Fund waiting list for children with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD) and behavioral health needs.

A breakdown of the funding needed in each region is on the back of this fact sheet.

Why Do This?

The Flexible Family Fund program is administered through each human services district and authority, or LGE, throughout the state. This program provides families of children with the most severe I/DD and behavioral health needs resources to help cover the excessive costs associated with supporting their child in their own home, regardless of their income.

This keeps families program together and children at home. All children, including those with families and endurina severe disabilities, need relationships with adults in home nurturing environment to develop to their fullest potential.

Many families who may not be eligible for other assistance benefit from this critical program.

Family members with limited ability to work and/or advance their careers due to caring for a child with a severe disability, are better able to manage their family's extensive needs with the help of the Flexible Family Fund.
