

## State Personal Assistance Program (SPAS) Quarterly and Cumulative Report FY 23-24 Project Period: July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024

One of the primary principles on which the SPAS program was founded is that adults with disabilities should be allowed to make decisions and live in typical homes and communities where they can exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens. Based on this principle, the SPAS program for the FY 2023-2024 is administered as follows:

Forty-five (45) consumers received services through the SPAS program this quarter.




Demographic information regarding race, gender, age, disability, and geographic location is noted below.

Age: Ranges from age 31 to 92.

**Disability:** Consumers represent a wide range of diversity in terms of disability, including acquired brain injury, Quadriplegia, spinal cord injury, stroke, visual impairment, muscular dystrophy, severe lung disease, acute renal failure, multiple sclerosis, chronic kidney disease, sickle cell anemia, brain aneurysm, partial paralysis, and individuals with various disabilities.

### Geographic Location by DHH Region (Table 2, Figure 3):





# Expenditure of Funds (Table 4, Figure 4)


Funding for direct services through the State Personal Assistance Program for July 1, 2023- June 30, 2024, is **\$893,052.**



## Waiting List – Currently, there are 90 people on the waiting list to receive services.



# Race (Figure 6):


