PROGRAM SERVICES

Pre-Employment Transition Services

Louisiana Rehabilitation Services (LRS) provides Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) to students with disabilities between the ages of 16 and 21 with an active Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or who meets the definition of a student with a disability as covered under Section 504 or who is a student who has a documented disability. Pre-ETS include Job Exploration Counseling, Work-Based Learning Experiences, Counseling on Post-Secondary Opportunities, Workplace Readiness Training and Training on Self Advocacy. LRS is currently providing services to approximately **4,020** students statewide.

LRS currently has 15 active Third Party Cooperative Arrangements (TPCA) with local or state education providers to provide Pre-ETS and is continuing to pursue additional TPCA's with local and state education providers.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Louisiana Rehabilitation Council (LRC):

The next LRC quarterly meeting is scheduled for January 25, 2024, and will be conducted at the LWC Headquarters in Baton Rouge. Statewide disABILITY Inclusion Job Fair:

In conjunction with National Disability Employment Awareness Month, the 2nd Annual Statewide Virtual Job Fair was conducted on October 11, 2023. LRS collaborated with Healthy Blue of LA to host this event. LRS staff coordinated both employer and job seeker recruitment.

2023 Virtual Job Fair Stats

- 68% (92 total) of registered job seekers attended the event
- There were 103 recruiters/employers registered to participate in the event, and 85% of them attended (88 total)
- There were a total of 188 chats conducted
- Employers rated 59 job seekers to "Pipeline (consider for future)"
- Employers rated 39 job seekers to "Screen further"
- Employers conducted 6 interviews

Benefits Planning:

Twenty-eight (28) LRS consumers have been directly assisted with their SSI and SSDI benefits planning since October 1, 2023, by the LRS in-house Community Partner Work Incentives Counselor. Lighthouse for the Blind and LSU Human Development Center also continue to provide Work Incentives Planning and Assistance.

DIF (Disability Innovation Fund) Project:

Project STEMM-Up is now in its third year. Twenty-One (21) LRS consumers have been referred to Southern University of Baton Rouge (SUBR) to begin the Social Cognitive Career Theory Assessment and Training. There are currently two full-time CPCs in Baton Rouge and Monroe, who have split the referrals and are covering all four of the participating regions.
