

Action Alert #13 FY25 Budget Moves to House Floor for Debate

April 23, 2024



An amended budget (<u>HB1</u>) for Fiscal Year 25 (FY25) made it out of House Appropriations today. Unfortunately, two issues LaCAN and the Council have been advocating for were left out of the package of amendments:

- 1. Eliminate the Flexible Family Fund Waitlist
- 2. Increase the Waiver Rate for Night Services

Advocates did receive some good news, though. The <u>additional \$500,000 in SGF for Families Helping Families Regional Resource Centers</u> was included in amendments to the supplemental budget (<u>HB782</u>). Thank you to the members of House Appropriations for recognizing the importance of FHF Centers across the state!

HB1 and HB782 will now head to the House Floor for debate on Thursday, April 25th. If any of the three issues above are important to you, contact your House Representative today!

Additional Information

Recurring Funding for Families Helping Families Regional Resource Centers

During the last three legislative sessions, an additional \$500,000 in state general fund (SGF) was added to the Council's budget specifically for FHF Centers. This increased the Council's SGF to \$1,007,517. Every dollar of state funds the Council receives supports the work of FHF Centers across the state. Initially, the Council's request to annualize the full budget was denied, essentially cutting funding to Centers by half. Fortunately, House Appropriations restored the \$500,000 via an amendment to HB782 when the committee met on 4/23/24.

Eliminate the Flexible Family Fund Waitlist

The Flexible Family Fund program is administered through the local human services districts/authorities and provides families of children with the most severe intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and/or behavioral health needs a monthly stipend to help cover the excessive costs associated with their care. In the link above, you will find the amount of state general fund (SGF) each district/authority needs to serve all eligible children on the FFF waitlist, which totals approximately \$9.4 million.

Increase the Waiver Rate for Night Services

Funding is needed to increase the rate for night services to match the current day rate within homeand community-based waivers for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Currently, the night rate is \$5 less than the day rate (\$13.52 vs \$18.52). This disparity is impacting the availability of Direct Support Workers willing to work nights leaving individuals and families in desperate situations. Approximately \$10.1 million in State General Fund is needed to fix this issue.
