YLF is a four-day residential leadership program focused on empowering youths with disabilities while promoting an environment of disability culture and pride. This program gives delegates the skills needed to become future leaders!

YLF is currently recruiting staff and delegates for its four-day program this summer. The program will be held **July 10 – 13, 2025** at the Louisiana State University at Eunice campus. All speakers are peer mentors with disabilities. In addition to learning about advocacy and leadership, delegates will have the opportunity to make like-minded friends and build community.

Lodging, accommodations, and meals will be provided at no cost. We have a staff to camper ratio of 1:1 as well as two RNs who will be onsite 24/7 during the program.
